


Love in 2020 is a light-hearted rom-com created during the pandemic by an amazing team of female filmmakers. The story is personal for me: As a single person, isolated from others and the usual distractions, this year of lockdown forced me to confront the relationship I have with myself. I learned that my ability to love myself affects every aspect of my life—my romantic relationships, my friendships, and my confidence as a filmmaker. That epiphany became the heart of this story and resonated with others. It became a source of light, joy, and creative purpose for our cast and crew during a very unsettling and scary time.

I hope that the experiences and dating mishaps of our protagonist, Kenna Benjamin, give people an excuse to laugh and feel less alone. If this past year has taught us anything, it's the importance of love and human connection to our well being. For me, this web series will always be special, because it was about love in front of and behind the camera. The love I have for my female friends and collaborators drove this project from the very beginning, and I am so grateful for what we made while the world shut down.



James Tang has been a host at a restaurant and worked at a pop-up food stall. He was previously an assistant to a talent manager. He's done algorithm training for tech companies and audio transcription. He's even had a job as a warehouse assistant for a children's science education company. Most recently, he's been <u>streaming on Twitch</u> and collecting tips and other micro-donations from his growing fanbase.

He's a working actor in Hollywood.

The stereotype in L.A. is that every server in a restaurant has a headshot or a screenplay. Pre-pandemic, the service industry typically attracted people in entertainment because of the flexibility. But working in a restaurant isn't your only option if you're starting out in Hollywood and looking for a day job.

Tang has been in Los Angeles for about seven years. His highest-profile credits include small roles on "Brooklyn Nine-Nine" and "NCIS: Los Angeles," and he's a love interest in the web series "Love in 2020." He has an agent, he signed with a new manager in December, and now that the pandemic has made self-taped auditions just as acceptable as in-person ones, he's getting more opportunities than ever. But even as someone who had patches of parental support when he was younger, he was barely scraping by before the pandemic, and he applied for unemployment benefits.

Actor Anna Jaller (Homecoming, Entourage the Movie) produces the series alongside director/editor Eirinn Disbrow (Ghostbusters, Snatched, Long Shot), writer Christina Garofalo Bonifacio (When

Dogs Heal, Robb Report, Huffington Post) and Brandi Hart Craig, (SPY, Game Night, Shazam); Director of Photography Kristin Mendez (CT Fletcher, Vegas Baby) completes the team.

Packed with Judd-Apatow style comedy, Love in 2020 doesn't shy away from heavier issues, including double standards for women in work and dating, the mental effects of isolation, and anti-Chinese racism. However, it was important to the producers to keep it light and stay true to a comedic tone.

"Ultimately, it's a story that asks who we want to be and how we want to show up in the world when this is over," says writer/producer Christina Garofalo Bonifacio. "When we look back on 2020, no one will forget the strife; it was important to us to give people permission to find joy and laugh during this time, too."



inding love in L.A. is hard enough, but as shown in Eirinn Disbrow and Christina Garofalo's series *Love in 2020*, it is almost impossible during a pandemic.





Anna Jaller plays Kenna, a young single woman bracing herself for what is hopefully a short stint in quarantine by crossing all her social events off her calendar. Already feeling alone, her roommate Melissa (Gabrielle Lane) asks if her boyfriend, Chad (Jeff Pierre), can also stay in their small apartment during the lockdown.

Love is 2020 is a six-part series, with the episodes running around five minutes each, walking alongside Kenna's journey to find love in the new normal. Episode one sets the stage as quarantine becomes a reality. Now living in forced seclusion, she must work from home and witness the romantic antics of Melissa and Chad.

In episode two, Kenna aggressively looks for companionship by going on a series of dating apps only to find that it's way too easy for her and her dates to hide behind false personas and appearances. As the series continues, Kenna is forced to examine what she really wants in a soulmate and what she really needs to feel like a whole person.

Love in 2020 takes a light look at love and relationship. It's shot in Los Angeles and not only observes an empty city in quarantine beautifully but also captures the beauty of sitting by a computer, lying in a bed, and finding oneself in solitude. Director Disbrow and writer Garofalo keep the story at a very grounded level of reality and speak to a broad audience of singles forced to adapt to the new normal of Zoom Dates and socially distant meet-ups.

Anna Jaller is fantastic as Kenna and carries the entirety of *Love in 2020*. Her performance falls more on the Rom side of the Rom-Com. She is very relatable and is probably someone you've met online.

Love in 2020 will screen at the 2021 Dances With Films.

WHY SHOULD I WATCH?

Love in 2020 is a timely new web series about surviving quarantine and attempting to date during a worldwide pandemic. The series follows Kenna Benjamin (Anna Jaller), a 28-year-old who's unlucky in love and hates her job. If life wasn't bad enough, watching everyone around her quarantine with a partner made her long for some companionship of her own; during a time when finding someone seems impossible. In search of a deeper connection, Kenna turns to dating apps. She refuses to suffer through the pandemic alone.

As the frequent obligatory single friend in my personal friend group, the description alone drew me in. Kenna's story is incredibly relatable from being the third wheel to almost reluctantly taking on the beast of online dating. The first episode pulled me in, but the follow up, "50 First (Facetime) Dates," had me glued. Watching Kenna change and slip into different versions of herself for every date, depending on the interests of her prospective matches, made me simultaneously shake my head in disapproval and take some notes. The drastic switch between surfer girl to hippie to preppy only for her to end up texting her ex back instead is exactly what I want out of my romantic dramas. Then, the episode ending with him asking to see her? It's the soapy cliffhanger dreams are made of.

Kenna's quarantine journey is a joy to watch. She goes from someone desperate to make a connection with a significant other above all else to learning the importance of being comfortable and loving yourself first. It's equal parts heartwarming and humorous and Jaller does a great job of making Kenna someone you can see yourself in. Her monologue about being agreeable so she can be deemed nice rather than being herself stuck with me long after the scene ended. The supportive cast is strong, too. James Tang absolutely made me have a crush on Jack and I suddenly need friends exactly like Melissa (Gabrielle Lane) and Chad (Jeff Pierre) in my life.

Aside from the stellar performances, there's a reason *Love in 2020* is so clever, enjoyable and genuine and it has everything to do with the team behind the scenes. The series is 100% written, directed, produced, shot and edited by women. It is the perfect example of how beautiful and entertaining a show can be when it's a collaborative effort with women at the forefront.

Anyone who felt like they went a little crazy in 2020, either because they were hoarding toilet paper or contemplating their entire life, needs to check out this series. It's a fun, bingeable show that will have you smiling. I've watched a handful of series surrounding the pandemic and *Love in 2020* was one of the best. I hope to see a lot more from this cast and crew.

A Rom-Com for the Pandemic Era

For years, Eirinn Disbrow '10, Christina Garofalo '10 and Anna Jaller '10 had been collaborating on a project about dating in Los Angeles, "but it never felt quite right or finished," Disbrow says. California's first COVID-19 lockdown last March provided both inspiration and time. The trio pivoted to a storyline about dating during the pandemic, and Garofalo wrote a script for a web series. *Love in 2020* (directed by Disbrow) follows 28-year-old Kenna Benjamin (played by Jaller) as she endures FaceTime dates, job-related struggles and the isolation of lockdown as a single person. The rom-com series filmed over four days in August. During post-production, a fourth Muhlenberg alum, Nick LaFalce '10, joined the team as its composer. Disbrow, Garofalo, Jaller and producer Brandi Craig are currently waiting to hear from film festivals.

Muhlenberg Magazine How did you address the challenges of filming during a pandemic?

Anna Jaller '10 Our producer Brandi Craig took on the role of health and safety manager, and we had a COVID safety officer [Garofalo's husband] to ensure that all protocols [including mandatory masking of all cast and crew except actors shooting scenes, limiting the number of people on set and using fans and opening windows between takes of indoor scenes] were being followed. Ultimately, through advance planning and prep, ground rules and people specifically designated to enforcing those rules, the rest of the team was able to come to set and focus on their artistry.

MM Why is it significant that your production team is all women?

Eirinn Disbrow '10 In 2019, women comprised 37 percent of lead characters, 26 percent of producers, 23 percent of editors, 20 percent of writers, 12 percent of directors and 2 percent of cinematographers in Hollywood. Women's experiences are important; our perspectives should shape the conversation. Things have been changing for the better, but there is still a lot of progress to be made, particularly for women of color. That is why diversity on set was nonnegotiable for us and we made it a priority to give each person a voice in shaping the narrative.

MM What was it like to create a project that's a snapshot of such a specific moment?

Christina Garofalo '10 Rather than try to say something profound about a time we're still living through, we focused on the ongoing, universal challenge: What happens when you're trapped at home and you can't escape yourself?

A couple weeks after the script was finished, George Floyd was murdered. We felt it was important to address race and privilege but didn't want to wedge it into our storyline just to check a box, or to approach it in bad faith by speaking for an experience that, as three white women, isn't our own. We decided to have honest, sometimes difficult, conversations with our diverse cast of actors and Brandi and to invite each person to challenge the script and shape the dialogue to what felt true to them.

In the end, we stuck to our original timeline: The six episodes take place over the first two months of quarantine, prior to the nationwide Black Lives Matter protests. We worked with our male lead, James Tang, to call out the anti-Chinese racism that plagued the early pandemic, and we included subtle nods to the ways we have been complicit and complacent in racism, privilege and neglecting our responsibility to one another.

Kenna's story is a "light" version of all of that, of course—it is a rom-com. When we look back on 2020, no one will forget the strife; it was important to us to give people permission to find joy and laugh during this time, too.
